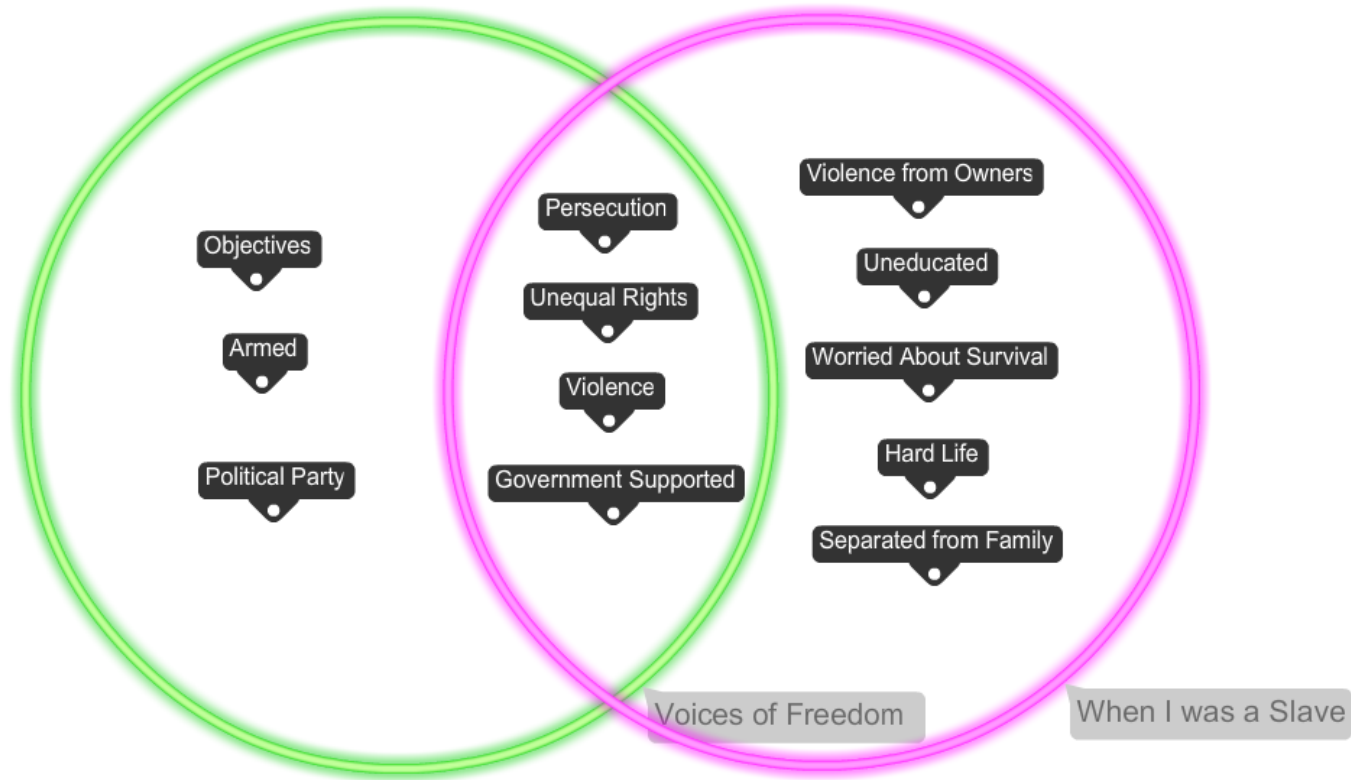
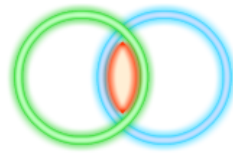

Items:

- **Persecution**

Black Panther Bobby Seale spoke of Panthers being a witness to as many police situations as possible. Former Slave Delia Garlic talked about how people could hear whippings from a mile away.

- **Unequal Rights**

Black Panther Huey Newton said that black Officer Kinner could only arrest black people. Former Slave Mary Anderson said that they would not teach any of us to read and write.

- **Violence**

Black Panther Huey Newton said that police would shoot blacks in the back for minor offenses. Former Slave W.L. Bost said cuts from whipping were about a half inch apart, and then salt was put on it.

- **Government Supported**

In both voices, violence and persecution was allowed and even encouraged at times. Juries would declare police brutality as not guilty and slavery was written into the constitution.

- **Uneducated**

Former slaves were uneducated and it showed in their voices.

- **Objectives**

Bobby Seale wanted organized political electoral power, full employment, decent education, not to have to fight in Vietnam, and an end to police brutality and murder of black people.

- **Worried About Survival**

Frank Bell spoke about how he was afraid to run because the Master said he would hunt him down and kill him.

- **Armed**

Huey Newton said that the first action of the Black Panther Party was to go down to Santa Fe Elementary School with our arms and be traffic police.

- **Political Party**

Huey Newton said that in October of '66 when the party was founded, there were only about one percents of black on the police department in Oakland, California.

- **Hard Life**

Even after freedom, Frank Bell said that in all his life, he never could make much money. He was even chained and forced to work for a while after slavery ended.

- **Violence from Owners**

Mary Armstrong told about how her owner Old Polly whipped her little sister to death because she cried too much.

- **Separated from Family**

Boston Blackwell said, "You see, after my mammy fot sold down to Augusta-"
